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Introduction

A funny thing that can help us win elections popped onto the airwaves early in 2002. This one was courtesy of our dear late Rush Limbaugh. Here is his reaction to a year of the Left blocking good things . . . just like they are doing right now in the Schumer Shutdown of October, 2025.

Rush gave us this ad via The Golden EIB Microphone on that January day:

- If you are unemployed and can find a job, DON'T WORK!
- Perhaps you are an employer and are ready to expand your work force, DON'T HIRE!
- You may want to place an order for an RV or remodel your house which would keep other Americans working, DON'T SPEND!
- These simple steps will make the Republican Administration look bad. We will win more elections for Congress this November. This message is brought to you by Terry McAuliffe at the Democrat headquarters.

Lots of us laughed at this perfect example of “illustrating absurdity by being absurd.” Sean Hannity, then the second biggest host in Talk Radio Land (TRL) said; You can always count on Rush to come up with a unique view on things.

This little book can help your college roommates, cousins, and co-workers see a few of the ways D.C. Democrats are bad for America. To do that we will (briefly) go to the year that inspired Rush to do that ad . . . and then laugh again.

Another use for this book may be even more important than reaching your contacts. Your grandparents (and I) heard “Teach, your children well” in a great song in 1970. A later verse includes “Teach, your parents well.” The facts ahead can help you to **MULTIPLY YOUR EFFORTS** by reaching the hosts of the Super Six Shows. These hosts speak to millions of people of all ages each week. . .

- This book is meant to augment, not to replace, the efforts of the good people at Turning Point, the GOP in Washington, etc.

What is the Link between Charlie and Rush?

Chapter 1: Enough Energy for You and Me

In May of 2001 something (potentially) fairly useful came out of 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue. The White House gave us an energy plan. (No previous administration had ever done this.) Over the next two months the Republican-led U. S. House of Representatives created a fairly compatible energy bill. For example, both included the use of 2,000 acres in the 1002 area of Alaska. (Some airports, like D/FW and LAX, cover more than 2,000 acres.) This led to one of the most hilarious moments in C-SPAN history. (Yes, on rare occasions funny things do happen even on C-SPAN.) The incredible drama played out on July 19, 2001. It was during Atomic Tom Daschle's Daily Senate Majority Leader's Press Conference. (Try saying that sentence quickly three times!) A young female reporter asked the Democrat leader about potential energy production on the 2,000 acres that both the House and White House agreed on. He replied that there is no need to "destroy, permanently" the 19,600,000 acres of that corner of our largest state . . . and most of the rest of the known universe.

Okay, I added the part about the rest of the known universe. However, as anyone who watched the movie *Twister* remembers, modern energy production does not "destroy" land. [Remember the scene where the lady puts two cups on the red truck and then drives off? Just behind the picket fence of a yard covered in green grass . . . is an oil pump. (It's surrounded by a tree!)] Atomic Tom, perhaps because of nightmares from his time in the Air Force, was apparently confusing drilling for oil with the dropping of astronomically sized bombs. (Ha, ha ha.)

How does any of this relate to Charlie Kirk? Since his untimely passing I've heard some of the hosts of the Super Six Shows in TRL (Talk Radio Land) say he was a fan of Rush. That's no surprise since both were "truth seekers" to use El Rush Bo's words. (In 1989 I first heard his refreshing approach to the news.)

Shortly after this chapter there's a pamphlet featuring a quick run-down on How the Left Harmed America for much of this century. The pamphlet can be useful for reaching new voters (mostly) beyond the college age . . . or REenlisting the Trump 24 Voters. (Turning Point may have better materials for younger

voters.) First; however, we will take a glance at things I've spent fifty four years researching including energy.

At this moment we are in the midst of an AI building bonanza. Each of these "facilities" will require as much energy as a small town. Many of our friends on the Left think (?) we can supply all of this increased demand by adding more windmills and solar cells. People who lived through the Texas Big Freeze of 2021 tend to have a different idea. Conventional sources are also worth having. This brings us to a man who is normally aligned with the Left: Bill Gates.

He has invested in the development of small nuclear power plants. They can be quite useful and will create zero emissions once they are on line. At this time most AI facilities are powered by clean burning natural gas.

This is where two movies and elections come along. (You just thought I had forgotten about elections.) First, I saw *Gasland*. It makes fracking, in particular, seem far worse than Atomic Tom's nightmares about dropping bombs to drill. THEN I saw *FrackNation*. This film clears up much of the misunderstanding about fracking from top voices on the Left. Both Rush and Charlie Kirk were closer to the "all of the above" approach for supplying us with energy. By the way, Appendix E has more on energy production and the significant environmental improvements we have made over the last fifty years. Here's one example: A Google search in October, 2025 said air pollution from cars was down 99% from 1970 levels!

We interrupt this regularly scheduled examination of the Left for an important message. YOU can help the hosts of the Super Six Shows do a better job. I didn't hear one of them in October, 2025 mention any U. S. House race of New York in 2026. Yet, they spent hours and hours talking about the contest for the Mayor of New York City. There was one exception to their almost-month-long fixation on that race. Hosts of those shows did mention that The Congressional Cutie (CC) of New York City may primary Chucky Schumer . . . in 2028. [He held up funding the government to defeat CC (Miss Ocasio-Cortez) . . . according to some folks in TRL.]

May I suggest that you write a letter about a way to win a few more races. (Remember "augment" from the introduction?) Sure, you can print it out . . . then

MAIL IT. Plus, have a few pals do the same thing but mail them separately. Here's a good format:

"Dear Senator Blackburn It is good to hear you talk to Clay and Buck and also to Sean. Would you please remind them of one thing. It's a tip for every *other* time they discuss Miss Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez. They can also mention various House races in that state. Plus, these folks can point out that all of these lefties have horrific voting records. (They voted against the 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Bill, and for Joe in 2020, and for Kamala in 2024.)

You can look at just a few votes to help you decide who to support for Congress. (Remember that this person may be in Washington for decades.)

- Even two years after the 9/11 attacks our economy still needed a boost. On the 23rd of May, 2003 Congress voted on The Jobs and Growth Reconciliation Act. This bill provided tax cuts for individuals *and* for businesses to invest in new equipment, software, etc. Most House Democrats voted “NO” including (future-Speaker of the House) Nancy Pelosi. Also, most Senate Democrats said “NO” including (future-Senate Majority Leader) Chucky Schumer, Hillary Clinton, and Joe Biden. (Over 90% of Democrats voted “NO.”) 1

Republicans voted for it. How well did the plan work? “Economy has best showing in 20 years” was the headline of the Associated Press (AP) article at the end of October, 2003. That’s how the article by Jeannine Aversa described the quarter (July – September) *right after* the bill passed.

- The next chance the House had to vote for a major bill to help our economy was on November 18, 2003. The bill was H. R. 6 and it would have expanded access to clean burning natural gas and would have improved conservation efforts. “Cornyn wants energy, environment compromise” was the AP article about this bill that ran in some papers in January, 2004. The AP made it clear it was “fierce opposition” from Democrats that stopped the bill that would have created up to “800,000” jobs. Most House Democrats voted “NO.” So did Hillary, Joe, and Chucky Schumer a few days later. Most Republicans voted for it. 2

· Another AP article reveals a third chance Congress had to help America. “Senate puts chill on Arctic drilling measure” ran in some papers in December, 2005. The bill would have opened 2,000 acres of the **1002** area in Alaska for energy production. (See the **f**ront **c**over of this pamphlet.) Plus, it would have slowed the *growth* of federal spending. Almost all Democrats said “NO” to more energy and jobs . . . including Hillary, Joe, Chucky Schumer and a new guy named Barack. (Opening this tiny area would employ people in software development, shipbuilding, steel production, and other areas across America.) EVERY Democrat (in the House and Senate) said “NO” to any limit on spending *growth*. Most Republicans voted for more energy, slowing the growth of the wasteful spending DOGE is trying to confront *right now* in 2025, and jobs.

[[Most Democrats said “NO” on using those 2,000 acres over and over again this century. (*Maybe they want us to push our cars?*) In 2005 they added “NO” to any limits on spending *growth*.]]

- On July 8, 2012 something incredible popped up on ABC’s *This Week*. A study by Stanford University revealed this fact: President Obama’s appointees to run the Commerce Department, the EPA, and other agencies over-regulated so much that . . . they prevented at least two million jobs from being created. Stopping the Keystone Pipeline was one tiny ice *cube* on the gigantic ice*berg* of ways that one Democrat Administration harmed job creation over four years. In 2017 ALL House and Senate Democrats, including (then-Senator) Kamala Harris, voted “NO” on The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017. The plan cut taxes for average Americans and was another chance to open those 2,000 acres in the **1002** area of Alaska for energy production. After it passed, The Tax Foundation discovered that this Republican plan cut taxes of the working poor by \$4 billion and of the middle class by \$31 billion in 2018. (The wealthiest among us actually paid more than before the act passed.) See Andy Puzder’s “The truth about Trump’s tax cuts . . .” which was updated on November 1, 2020. (It’s on the finance.yahoo site.)**3**

How well did this plan help our economy? It worked well with the activities of the White House. The Republican Administration cut useless regulations. [See those two million jobs from 2012. (above)] On October 6, 2019 NBC’s *Meet the Press* reported that we had the lowest unemployment rate in fifty years!

Vote for jobs, fiscal sanity, and energy. Vote Republican for the U. S. Senate and House. Also, why vote for a local or state leader who supported Hillary, or Barack, or Joe? Please pass this pamphlet to a friend today! _____

Extra: On Christmas Eve '25, while at a (national chain) restaurant, I ran into a guy with a MAGA cap. We were both *glad* about some things going on in D.C. He was beyond shocked when I asked him: How can you help Mr. Trump next November? Then I gave him (a copy) of the pamphlet . . . and asked him to PASS IT ON. This may be a key for you and me to win a few extra seats!

Chapter 2: No Limits

What may be worse than the Left being anti-energy and anti-job?

- In 2010 Admiral Mullens surprised more than a few members of Congress. The Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff said our greatest threat is debt. (Ships and airplanes cost a lot . . . and so does the Park Service and the FBI and NASA and so on.) Currently we pay as much on the *interest* of our national debt as we do for defense!!!
- About a month ago former Democrat Joe Manchin described to Bryan Kilmeade how our budget ballooned over the last few years. (While in Congress Joe butted heads with his party's leadership on spending.) The last budget *before* COVID was 4.4 trillion dollars. The COVID year (2020) it grew by a few TRILLION dollars. Then it never returned to "normal" during the time of President Biden and Senate Majority Leader Schumer. For leftists like Chucky Schumer and CC and her Silly Sister Squad there is No Limit Like No Limit on federal spending.

Many of our fellow citizens need you to ask them the following questions: Did we have a Forestry Service, a Food and Drug Administration, and an FBI before COVID . . . with a budget of 4.4 trillion? Yes, we did. Then why did Joe and his fellow Democrats keep the budget up by a few TRILLION dollars **AFTER** the "crisis" of COVID was gone? Once they ponder those questions then ask this: If a car was priced at \$30,000 would you like to pay \$45,000 for it? Of course they will say, NO! Chucky and other top leftists want No Limits on spending. (There is also No Limit on the amount of land they want to set aside for frogs, and flowers, and flees. See those 2,000 acres in the pamphlet above.)

Sean Hannity occasionally had Tom Schatz of Citizens Against Government Waste on his show earlier this century. (I haven't heard about CAGW for years.) More recently, Sean (and others) have had Steven Moore on their shows to explain steps to "fix" Social Security and Medicare funding so they can continue to be financially viable.

Let me remind you of one other thing you saw in the pamphlet. (Yes, this ties into the "greatest threat" Admiral Mullens mentioned.) In December, 2005 NOT ONE Democrat voted to even slow the g-r-o-w-t-h of spending. Neither Hillary nor Barack nor Nancy Pelosi nor Joe nor Chucky Schumer did.

Here's an easy way to remember the pamphlet. Just think of 1, 2, 5, and '17. From 2001-2004 Democrats prevented the creation of at least ONE million jobs. [On March 19, 2003 and other occasions most Senate Democrats voted NO on using those 2,000 acres. Plus, most rejected another energy plan in November, 2003. (Even Atomic Tom liked this one. Remember the 800,000 jobs!) Also, they held up an economic stimulus from the end of 2001 until May 23, 2003.]

Then these Democrats in Congress voted to anoint Barack as the Liberal in Chief. What did his appointees do? The heads of the Commerce Department, the EPA, the State Department, and so on PREVENTED the creation of at least TWO million jobs. [See the pamphlet and Keystone. (It's just one example of many.)]

Overwhelmingly, these Democrats are also trying to toss FIVE million others out of work. How? They want us to rapidly switch to undependable alternative energy sources. This will a) toss many conventional energy people out of work and b) raise energy costs. That will result in shipping more (factory) jobs out of the U. S.

In the summer of 2018 former Speaker Newt Gingrich explained the '17. While talking to Sean he mentioned that EVERY Democrat voted against the 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Bill. That included (supposedly moderate) Joe Manchin.

What can you conclude about D.C. Democrats? They want NO LIMITS on spending and undependable energy production. We should toss them all!

Meet the other Charlie When I returned to the states in 1980 I first voted for Republican Ronald Reagan for the highest office. I also voted for Charlie Stenholm, a Democrat, for the House. He had a fairly common-sense approach to government.

By 1992, I stopped voting for Charlie . . . because he did not warn us about Bill and Hillary Clinton. (Rush DID.) Now jump to 2001 - 2004. Sen. Zell Miller was the ONLY member of his party in the Senate to vote for all three major job creating bills.

Chapter Three: The Day After The DISASTER - Nov. 5, 2025

Originally this chapter was supposed to be “One Vote.” Then came the “gales of November.” (Ask your grandparents about “The wreck of the Edmund Fitzgerald.”) Yes, the Commie Mamdani, to quote Curtis Sliwa, won the New York race hosts in TRL spent lots of time on. Remember from CH. 1 that they did not (in the MANY times I heard them) mention a U. S. House race in that state. Of course, this spring many leaders on the right saw President Trump’s great cabinet meetings. They concluded that We Will Automatically Win races in 2026. Not me!

To add emphasis to that point let me remind you of a few races from 2024. A week before that first Tuesday in November, Kelly Cooper was only about 350 votes behind the Democrat. (In 2022 he was eight thousand votes behind at the same point in the cycle.) After the Arizona primary in July of ‘24 (See Dr. Zhudi Jassar.) no one I heard in TRL even mentioned this race.

In 2024 I heard something new from my favorite member of Congress. Marvelous Marsha Blackburn went to Ohio to help Bernie Moreno defeat another “Communist” (as Bernie called Sherrod Brown). The Leftie’s voting record was 1, 2, 5, and ‘17 just like Nancy Pelosi’s and Chucky Schumer’s. [[In the eleven previous years I heard Sen Blackburn on various programs she had n-e-v-e-r mentioned a race to win.]] What did Marvelous MISS in 24? She did not mention Marcy Kaptur in the U. S. House who is in Ohio. This was a **c-l-o-s-e** race . . . and the perfect opportunity to kill two birds with one stone. [Marcy’s record was exactly like Sherrods! (1, 2, 5, and ‘17)] Years earlier, they were in the House at

the same time . . . so Marvelous should have remembered Marcy's bad voting record.

[Let me thank President Trump and his family before going on. (THEY WORKED HARD TO WIN ELECTIONS in 2024.) As (almost) newcomers to politics I would not expect them to know what you are about to read . . . or what "head space" is to an infantry unit.] In 2003 Zell Miller wrote "A National Party No More" and covered a 1990s attempt to eliminate the filibuster. He also covered his version from this century. Let me suggest a compromise. On the first vote make it 60 votes to pass. Then, two weeks later make it 59. If it still fails make it 58 two months later. Then drop a vote every other season thereafter.

You may already realize something . . . but not why I brought it up. In the 1970s we had a Doper Army. (I was not a doper!) Two of our top leaders on the right, Sen. McCormack and Colonel West, both benefited from the dramatic improvements made to our military by Ronald Reagan in the 1980s. These improvements helped them to be part of our most successful war which was in 1991. Right now WE DON'T HAVE TEN YEARS TO SHAPE UP THE GOP!

Just today ((Nov. 7th)) even Bryan Kilmeade said We Are in A Civil War. ((Bill O' Reilly said this to Sean a few years back . . . and recently Arron Reitz said we are in an Existential Struggle.)) That's why providing something useful like my little pamphlet can help. In 2024 I heard a good Republican candidate, Eric Hovde, with Mark Levin, Clay and Buck, and others in TRL. NOT ONCE did anyone bring up Democrat Tammy Baldwin's record of 1, 2, 5, and '17. Yes, they mentioned that she voted for Joe's agenda. That was better than none, but not by much. (Tammy won by about 1% . . . in a state with plenty of blue collar folks.)

Lots of blue collar workers were interested in Mr. Trump's message in 2024. WHAT IF THEY HAD BEEN INFORMED OF 1, 2, 5, and '17? My guess is many would have passed that information on to other potential Trump voters . . . and we would have more Republicans in the House and Senate. (Heh, a few extra would be better than none. We barely passed the Big Beautiful Bill.)

Let me throw in a slightly positive, yet realistic, note. In September, 2018 Mark Levin did something good. He mentioned a U. S. House (?) race. Just doing so raised thousands of dollars for our candidate. (Some listen and then GIVE!)

Good people like Troy Jackson (PhD) of Dallas (now) and the TEA Party (in 2010) give me hope. You may do far more than they did/or/are doing with just a few numbers (1, 2, 5, and '17) and a letter or two to (Marvelous, Chip Roy, Rand Paul, Dana Loesch, etc.) Write and convince a few of your pals to write-the-same person. Do it now, please!

[Rush said repeatedly that “We are engaged in a battle for the hearts and minds of men.” Sean and Glenn Beck said they agreed over and over again. Violence, such as that against Charlie Kirk, has no place in a democracy.]

Appendix A: By the end of November, 2001 both Senate Republicans and Democrats (Atomic Tom’s people) offered stimulus plans. Why then? According to the National Bureau of Economic Research we entered into a recession in March of that year. (I heard it on the news about the start of November, 2001.) This was “the” major attempt of the left to help our economy early this century. As you will soon read, it lacked some things . . . just like everything else the Left does.

The Heritage Foundation’s economic team looked at both proposals late that year. They concluded either would help create 200,000 jobs in 2002 if passed quickly. THE difference was later on down the road. Since the R plan called for long tax cuts it was found to be much more likely to help in later years.

EXTRA EXTRA EXTRA Here’s where we have a bit of a problem talking to some of our fellow citizens. As Rush used to say, the various outlets of the Mainstream Press are the “willing accomplices” of the Left. Here’s a typical example from *The Good, The Bad, and The Unlikely to Help*. (It was my 2008 neo-classic.) In June, 2001 former GOP leader Hailey Barber was a guest on the (now defunct) *Hannity and Colmes* program. Alan Colmes asked why Republicans in Congress were not backing THE Patients Bill of Rights. (It was sponsored by Senators McCain, Kennedy, and Edwards.) Hailey responded that there was an alternative bill (“A” PBOR) that most Republicans supported. Lisa Myers of NBC and the rest of the Mainstream Press also acted as if “THE” was the only version. (They ignored “A” like the plague.) Rush did a great montage of Sen. Edwards saying “There’s no difference” in the two plans. [Note the big difference: “THE”

allowed suing MDs, etc., in more PROFITABLE courts. “A” did not *and* John Edwards is a trial lawyer. (Most in his profession support Democrats.)]

BONUS: When someone talks about “fairness” ask if they like the FAIR Tax or the FLAT tax more.

Appendix E Modern mineral extraction can be virtually benign for the environment. For example, the coal industry ran a great ad thirty (Yes, that’s 30.) years ago. They showed before, during, and after shots of a strip mine (in Wyoming?). It clearly showed land can be “restored” . . . much like The History Channel has a show on Oak Ridge and the incredible biological (!!!) aid to cleaning up radiation. Plus, keep in mind that we had the first Clean Air Act over fifty years ago. [* Even Sen. John Kerry (Mr. Enviro) said the expansion of the Clean Air Act in 1990, under the first President Bush, drastically reduced emissions from coal fired power plants. (A Google search on October 17, 2025 revealed SO₂ emissions were down 85% from Coal Fired Power Plants and NO_x emissions were down by 84%.) Did you know that the first Clean Air Act in the 1970s was also signed by a Republican in the White House?]

{If you are an English Comp professor or site “builder”: Please accept my sincerest apologies for this crude multi-page presentation.}

THE TOP 300 and You: Tim Scott at the Rocky Mountain Leadership Forum in 2014 gave an example, i.e. a vote, of the Left versus jobs. (He was on C-SPAN.) Sean on May 18, 2004 told a caller that the Left prevented opening the 1002 and thus creating jobs. Plus in 2010 (and 2012) he had The Political Roadmap. (You could click on a member of Congress to find out who voted for Barack’s COUNTER-productive bills.) Newt in 2014 was at an event with Rand Paul and Laura Ingraham and Louie Gohmert in New Hampshire. Only Newt mentioned a vote of Sen. Shaheen versus jobs. Then, in the summer of 2018 he told Sean that the Left voted a) against eliminating the Job Killing/Inefficient Obamacare and b) against the 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act , and c) to keep the borders open until the end of time. All three votes (a,b,c) happened the first time Mr. Trump was in office. Also, in 2020 Mark Levin said “A vote For Trump is a vote for Jobs and a vote for Joe is a vote for Mobs” a few weeks before the elections. Laura Ingraham said something similarly cute in (?) 2018. In December, 2023 Marvelous told Clay and Buck that a Republican Senate majority would affect “directionality.” These few examples are

as close as the Top 300 came to 1,2,5 and '17. (At least they were the closest in the thousands of hours I heard them this century.)

A few of you may be wondering; Just who are the hosts of the Super Six Shows? In November, 2024 *Talkers* magazine (a talk radio trade journal) listed Sean as the number 1 most listened to talk radio host. Bryan Kilmeade was number 2, Clay and Buck shared the # 3 spot, Dana Loesch was number 4 with Mark Levin at number 5 and Michael Barry at number 6. [[Yes, I left out Dave Ramsey because he does not do POLITICAL radio.]] Note that Joe Pags and Glenn Beck are worth sending a message to, as well.

[[**Forgot to add** in version 1: In 1997 I concluded that whatever government does affects different people differently. [The draft helped us win WW II . . . and led to some (who would NOT have fought) paying a high price for our freedom.]

Since 2002 I've made pamphlets. [I've been in contact with over 175 campaigns including the one of Ted Cruz (2012) to a House race in NH in 2022. (Karoline Leavitt's)] None, as far as I know, "augmented" their campaigns with my materials. At the same time, the hosts of the Super Six Shows haven't come close to being this specific and concise. (Mark Levin's informative books and Sean's Road Map weren't exactly highly portable.) Yet, Sean has said "You can never underestimate the ability of (D. C.) Republicans" to throw elections. Mark Levin in 2014 blamed Mitch McConnell for a Democrat Senate. As Rush used to say, "Hmm." [The Super Six Shows reach m-i-l-l-i-o-n-s.]

Wow! Look at what just happened!
